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The Alaska Expedition assaults the legendary Bonneville Salt Flats and approaches the territory of Alaska

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Dawson City, Yukon, Canada, June 27, 2016.- Dubanok, the Colombian-Mexican biker came to the north of Canada in its Alaska Expedition but on the way made a forced passage through the legendary Bonneville Salt Flats, famous salt desert of 260 square miles, located in the state of Utah.

This famous site is a remnant of the lake of the same name that was in that place and that nowadays it is used for speed races where cars and motorcycles have achieved some of the most important world records of speed.

Dubanok said in passing Bonneville: "It is one of the most beautiful places on earth, where built the most impressive feats among lovers of speed on wheels. "

The biker explained that since 1912 "began to prove" in this place who had the value of reach the limit, and by 1930 had already become popular as the fastest place on earth.

Some of the greatest feats of speed in this place were those of Sir Malcolm Campell, who in 1935 reached the 484 kms / h, as well as that of 1965 in which Craig Reedlove arrived at the spectacular speed of 965 km / h in Spirit of America.

Herbert J. "Burt" Munro, who is an icon of the passion for motorcycles, deserves a special place. Munro was born in New Zealand in 1899 and in 1967, near 70 years of age, decided to make a crossing

traveling from Invercargill, New Zealand, to the Bonneville Salt Flats to take part in the race of the Week of the Speed that is celebrated every year in that place.

Despite not being registered, Munro managed to overcome the barriers and achieved a speed record of motorcycles of less than 1000 cc surpassing the 300 kilometers per hour. The New Zealander came back to his country to return about nine times, each resulting in a record before death.

After being in this mythical place for lovers of speed, Dubanok, sponsored by Black Label Biker, continued with its Alaska Expedition and entered Canadian territory towards the Yukon region by the Alaska Highway, with what already adds more than 9000 kilometers from the City of Mexico where began this journey until Dawson City the north of Canada.
